He worked with Members of Parliament and top college students to create and implement the first Macedonian Parliamentary Intern Program. Upon graduation, Tracey served as Senior Program Director for the National Student Leadership Forum on Faith and Values. In that role, he assisted Members of the House of Representatives and the United States Senate to envision, plan and establish leadership conferences and programs throughout the United States for college student leaders.
